Belva loved her family and would make a point to tell them all that she loved and appreciated them as often as possible, with a big hug, text or phone call.

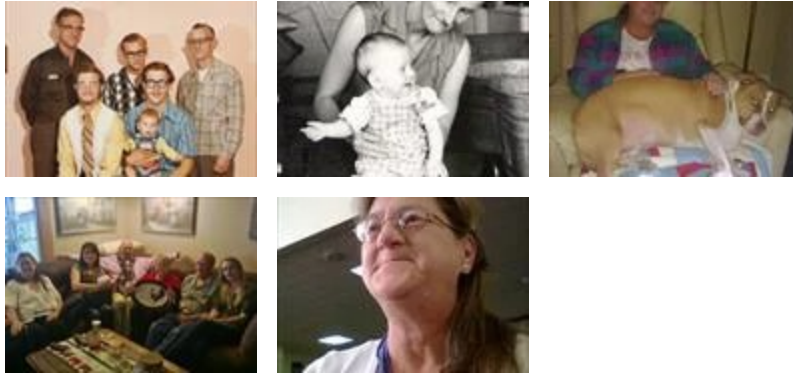
